


The book sits here upon the table, I'd read it through if I were able. But despite its value and ideals soaring, I must confess it's goddamn boring.







Or who could forget artist Pablo Picasso's "Guernica," his protest against the German destruction of a Spanish village?


Painted abstractly, one can see in the painting suffering, terror of the

dying and, if you squint and tilt your head, a horsie and a duckie.

Each of these works in its own way relates the many emotions of impending death and since dead men tell no tales, this may be the only way we'll ever find out. In each case death is the foe, something to avoid at all costs, yet all of these great artists have died. Can we call these men hypocrites or simply careless? Can we call them at all? Collect?

The dying are left to ponder their fate. They ask themselves what are they doing, where are they going, will there be all-night doughnut shops when they get

there? It is here that one begins to look for a here-after, a life after death, the great beyond, nirvana, heaven and the just deserts, hence the doughnut shops. As you face eternity, you re-live your past. Your failures come to haunt you toward your demise: "Maybe setting the history teacher on fire was a mistake," "Stapling my aunt's lips together wasn't a terribly bright move," "It's not too late. I can still sell that swampland in Florida." But what happens after you die? Is there an after-life? Will it be heaven as I was taught? Does it have an expansion team? Many scientists are showing proof that there is an after-life but are still unsure as to what the cover charge is. 

V89.0095 INTRODUCTION TO DRUG ABUSE

Fundamental principles of drug abuse, including habituation and physiological dependence are studied, with emphasis on learning by doing. Topics studied include marijuana and hashish, mescaline, LSD, PCP, amphetamines, barbiturates and opiates. Newcomers to the world of street drugs such as whipping cream, Locker Room and Rush are briefly discussed. Students are encouraged to learn about drugs of abuse through thorough experimentation. Planned outings include a trip to a Grateful Dead concert.

A41.0002 EXPOSITORY WRITING

Prerequisite: A41.0001. Required by all students for graduation, no exemptions. This course may not be taken on a Pass/Fail basis.

This course completes the sequence begun with A41.0001. A detailed study of topics introduced during the fall semester, students will be required to write five 20-page research papers each week. Instructors will demonstrate advanced techniques of torture such as whipping, toothpicks under fingernails, the pillory, the ducking stool, writing assignments and bad breath. Readings include selected writings from the Marquis de Sade and One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest. Students failing to realize that Writing Workshop is a huge cosmic joke by midterm will receive a grade of "N."

V43.0025 MODERN ART

An introduction to art in New York City from the late 1960's to the present. Decorative designs on subway stations and trains, buildings and sidewalks will be stressed. V25.0329 ORGANIC SYNTHESIS

An introductory course in the synthesis and purification of simple organic compounds. Emphasis is placed on the detection of impurities and other undesired contaminants. Laboratories include the chromatography of Loeb Cafeteria food for the detection of toxic matter and the synthesis of Alka-Seltzer for those who ate there prior to class.

V89.0052 MENTAL ILLNESS

Personality disorders, neuroses and psychoses will be studied in detail. Emphasis is on schizophrenia and its treatment by behavior modification, chemotherapy and prolonged basket weaving. Students failing to contract their favorite mental illness will receive an incomplete.

V63.0027 LABORATORY DATA COLLECTION AND COMPILATION
This course is designed to give a detailed introduction to the principles of laboratory data collection and representation. Emphasis is placed on how to lie with statistics, faking probabilities and fudging laboratory data when erroneous results threaten grades. Sabotaging other people's projects will be briefly discussed along with the best methods for accomplishing this. This course is required for entrance into medical school.

Ogg was a very ugly guy, even for a cave man, and always had a curious odor about him. Not surprisingly, he never stayed in the same place too long, as nobody would have him. One night during his wanderings, he stumbled on a small community of fish-eaters who let him spend the night. Ogg knew that he would have to do something so that these people would accept him. Suddenly, something dawned on him and he ran outside where the townspeople were gathered around the fire belching. "Friends," he cried, "Listen to

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me! Why did the Dinosaur cross the road?" Several people mumbled, but nobody knew. Ogg grew sad, and when they asked him why, he could not answer. Soon Ogg was wandering once again.

no more left to lose


